CD Pass 'Must' In All Disaster Areas

Special Civil Defense passes are required for entry by any person or vehicle into the flood devastated areas, into Civil Defense headquarters and all rescue stations, Civil Defense Director Norman R. Robertson has announced.

The Fortuna police department is headquarters for passes in the southern areas, with area headquarters here handling the rest. Strict control is being exercised and passes will be issued on a business-only basis, it was announced.

Captain Dan Larza, commander of the Eureka Area of the Highway Patrol, stated that no person will be allowed to pass

the check-points without the CD passes.

Meanwhile, the Board of Supervisors is meeting daily at 11 a.m. for briefing and coordinating sessions.

Sonoma Aid

The Sonoma Board of Supervisors today notified the Humboldt Board that it is ready to assist in any way possible, and that a number of trained sanitarians are on a stand-by basis to come here if requested.

A new warning also was issued on tampering with living livestock, with the District Attorney's office announcing that anyone butchering or making off with stray animals will be prosecuted for grand theft.

It was re-emphasized that when a disaster area has been declared, nothing is legal salvage.

Clothing Needed

The Salvation Army and St. Vincent De Paul organization also issued a new call for clothing, especially children's and rain gear, for packing and distribution from the centers at Wash and A Streets and Second and G Streets in Eureka.

Local Weather

For Eureka and vicinity: Mostly cloudy with occasional rain or showers and some thunder showers today and tonight.
