Rear Admiral Henry Louis Miller assumed command of Carrier Division FIFTEEN May 5, 1961. A native of Fairbanks, Alaska, Rear Admiral Miller graduated from the Naval Academy in 1934. He was designated a Naval Aviator at the Naval Air Station, Pensacola, in June 1938.

RADM Miller's service has included duty at sea in the battleship TEXAS; as a member of Fighting Squadron THREE aboard the USS SARATOGA; Commander of Air Group 23 aboard USS PRINCETON; Commander of Air Group 6 aboard the USS HANCOCK; Executive Officer of Composite Squadron SEVEN and the USS LEYTE; and as Commanding Officer of the USS HANCOCK.

He was a Flight Instructor and Personnel Officer of the Naval Station, Ellyson Field, Florida. While there during the early part of World War II, he trained General Doclitt's "Tokyo Raiders" in carrier take-offs, then accompanied them within 700 miles of their destination.

He has served as Public Information Officer on the staff of the Commander in Chief, Atlantic Fleet; Commanding Officer of the U.S. Naval Station, Sangley Point, Luzon, Philippine Islands; Commander, Fleet Air Philippines; and as Commander, Naval Air Bases Philippines.

He had duty in the Navy Department in the Office of Naval Research, the Strategic Plans Division and as Director of the Progress Analysis Group of the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations; and as Chief of Staff to Commander, Naval Air Force, Pacific Fleet prior to assuming his present duties as Commander, Carrier Division FIFTEEN.

His decorations include the Legion of Merit with Combat "V", Distinguished Flying Cross with four gold stars, the Air Medal with five gold stars, the Air Force Commendation Ribbon, and the Navy Unit Commendation.

He is married to the former Miss Lucille Dean of Opp, Ala. They have two sons, ages 7 and 19.
