

Other Points of Interest

BLOW HOLE—Near Koko Crater. Waves force water to shoot up out of hole in reef.

COAL GARDENS—Colorful ocean-bottom growths can be seen from glass-bottom boats at Ala Wai Bridge, Kaneohe, or Heleiaua.

HANAUVA BAY—Extinct volcanic eruption open to the sea. Fine picnic grounds.

HONOLULU AIRPORT—Between Honolulu and Pearl Harbor, "The Flying Crossroads of the Pacific."

KOKO CRATER—Youngest extinct crater on island, about 5,000 years old.

KOKO HEAD—High mass of rock sticking out into ocean near Koko Crater, forming a part of Heaununu Bay.

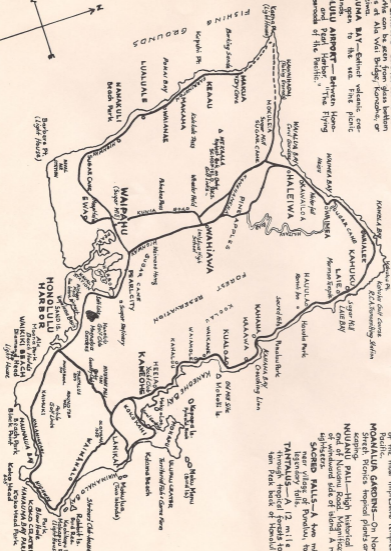
MORMON TEMPLE—Near village of Lāie; beautiful landscaping surrounding one of the most impressive temples in the Pacific.

MOANALUA GARDENS—On North King Street. Picnic, tropical plants and landscaping.

NUUANU PALI—High historical cliff at end of Nuuanu Road. Magnificent view of windward side of island. A must for hikers.

SACRED FALLS—A two mile hike near village of Punahoa, to scenic legendary falls.

TANTHALUS—A 12 mile drive through tropical forests to Moanaihan Park back of Honolulu.
