Ships of many nations were there,  
including many Japanese ships which  
were either sunk or shot up. The main  
warships up the bay battleship  
Togo which about eleven had bombed  
two carriers were found half submerged  
as a result of our bombing.

Many buildings had been blown  
up. The Japanese had many underground  
hangars, ammunition storage and food  
storage.

Sept. 15, 1945

Left Tokyo Bay and are now  
heading south.

Sept. 23, 1945 A.M.  
Arrived in Saigon

Sept. 23, 1945 7:19.  
Left Saigon are heading  
southeast.

Sept. 27, 1945  
Arrived at Eniwetok which is  
one of the Marshall Islands just a  
few hundred miles north of the  
Equator

Painted ship, and loaded supplies

Oct. 7, 1945

Left Eniwetok are heading  
north. The rumor is, Tokyo  
again
