A "Nuty" was shot down over Task Group 364, at 1123, Other energy planes were reported but fields At 1301 Admiral Halogy broadcast ness of the Japaness surrender which our stip's amounting system cent over the ship, At 1315 a bopy was reported, and a few minutes later was shot down by a cap from another carrier of our Group, During the late aftermeen the battle flags of all the ship in the formation were broken. The Bennington broke the two star Admiral's flags.
