

**BASEBALL** -- One field in Kings Park on the Kowloon side. Arrangements for use of field are made through manager of the field. Contact may be made through the station ship or Servicemen's Guide.

**SOFTBALL** -- Same as Baseball.

**BASKETBALL** -- Two courts, one in Hong Kong Southern Playground about five blocks from the landing pier. The other court is in Kowloon at Queen Elizabeth Playground. Both courts are anxious to arrange games in the evening between local teams and the U.S. Navy. During the day, courts may be used for practice. Use of the courts may be arranged through the court manager who may be contacted through the Station Ship or Servicemen's Guide.

**TENNIS** -- Four courts in the Causeway Bay district are available when not in use by British Servicemen. They are a short trolley ride from the Fleet landing.

**YACHTING** -- Sailing craft for officers are available at the Royal Hong Kong Yachting Club.

**BICYCLES** -- Bicycles may be rented in shops along Hennessy Road opposite Southern Playground for not more than HK\$1.00 per hour.

**HANDBALL** -- A handball court is located behind Victoria Barracks.

**BOWLING ALLEYS** -- The Royal Hong Kong Yachting Club has several alleys available for officers. The China Fleet Club has four alleys for all personnel.

**POOL AND BILLIARDS** -- Various service clubs have pool and billiards tables available. Among these is the Mission to Seaman just across the street from Fleet Landing.

**GYMNASIUM** -- Weight lifting, boxing and other equipment are available at the Mission to Seaman Gym across the street from the Fleet Landing.

**GOLF** -- **Shiki** -- Officers must be accompanied by members-- No guests on Saturday and Sunday.

**ROYAL HONG KONG GOLF CLUB** -- Has two courses, Fanling and Deepwater Bay, open to officers and enlisted men. Permits may be obtained through Servicemen's Guide. Fanling has two 18 hole courses and a practice course; is about an hour train ride from Kowloon. Deepwater Bay has 9 holes, very short and tricky; is about 20 minutes taxi ride from Fenwick Pier. Course is restricted on Saturdays, Sundays, Wednesday afternoons and holidays.

It is suggested that to use the Royal Hong Kong Golf Club Courses, ships should list those desiring to play and submit the list to Servicemen's Guides who will obtain necessary permits. It is impossible to obtain permits individually. The Club is insistent that only qualified players use the courses and that applicants to play provide their own clubs.
