For three weeks, BENN-INGTON participated in the largest training exercise of our current deployment -- the SEATO Exercise SEA DEVIL. From the 16th of April until the 45 of May, we operated alone with some 47 ships. 150 aircraft and over 16,000 men of the navies of Australia, New Zealand. Pakistan, Thailand, and Great Britain with the Philippines providing administrative support. This was the 21st exercise conducted by the South East Asia Treaty Organization since the member nations signed the collective defense treaty in September, 1954. During the exercise
