In addition, a hand-to-hand combat demonstration by MARDET and (hopefully) a deadload demonstration of the ship's catapult system will be offered.

During both visiting periods, guided tours will be offered and the 13th ND Band will be on hand for afternoon concerts at 1400. CAPT C. E. Healy will give a welcome speech prior to each of the concerts.

At 1430 Saturday, BENN will honor local people whose friendship and coop-

eration has made our stay so enjoyable. We are hoping to have these Bremerton Ceremonies covered via a remote radio broadcast by KBRO.
