The six men in the whale boat are: the coxswain, in command of the boat; an engineman, there in case of engine trouble; the bowhook, to help pull the man from the water; a corpsman, provides needed emergency first-aid: a signalman, keeps the ship informed of the situation; and a marine is on hand with a carbine to ward off sharks.
