RENNINGTON'S 20th BIRTHDAY the Panama Canal enroute to ivation overhaul, she was decommissioned and placed in the Atlantic Recerve Fleet at Norfolk 8 November 1946. After four years in preservation. BEZUNINGTON, on 30 October 1950, steamed from Norfolk to the New York Naval Shipward for modernization prior to recommissioning. For two years she received major alterations which expanded her operating capabilities as well as making significant changes to her dimensions and appearance. BENN now weighed 40,500 tons and gained 43 feet in overall length and 8 feet at the beam, a stronger flight deck, stronger elevators, and higher capacity catapults. BENNINGTON was now
