Red-retter oal in the Care of the rest USS Bearingdon was Jamary 17, 899, when she took possession of Wake shird. On that day the commanding ficer of the little gunboat which had een christened Beunington in June 1890 as the late Commander Edward David Taussig, USN, later Rear Admiral and father of the new Vice Admiral Joseph K, Taussig, USN, (ret.) The stars and stripes were immediately hoisted over Wake and the following inscription screwed near the base of the flagstaff:
