COMMANDING OFFICER

Captain Robert N. Ware took command of the ENNINGTON 21 September 1950. He was born in Eagerman, New Mexico and attended high school in Twin Falls, Idaho and preparatory school in Washington, D. C. He graduated from the Naval Academy in 1957 and reported for his first duty aboard the carrier USE LEKINGTON.

Designated a Naval Aviator in 1940 after flight training in Pensacola, Fla., Capt. Ware reported to the USS WASP and VS-72 in 1941.

Following the sinking of the WASP, he went to NAS Daytona Beach as an instructor, and then to VB-17 aboard the USS HORMET as Commanding Officer in 1952.
While flying in the Pacific, he

participated in the first landings on Guadaleanal, the first strikes on Japan, the Iwo Jima and Okinaswa landings and the sinking of the Japanese battleship YAMATO. Cantain Ware's decorations in-
