## 21,000,000 KILLED OR WOUNDED IN SECOND WORLD WAR

San Francisco, 14 August - The end of world-wide war two marks the close of the enormous conflict in which almost twenty three million were killed or wounded in combat -- not counting millions killed by starvation, air raids and other causes. Japan's military clique, which had chosen to lead the Japanese people into what amounted to national suicide, has been smashed. Admiral Georoku Yamamoto once boasted that he would dictate peace terms in the Washington White House, but that boast along with the Greater East Asia Co-prosperity Sphere, the Reich of a thousand years and the New Order, Mussolini's eight million bayonets and new Roman Empire stand today as empty vain glories.

Japan was completely overwhelmed by new weapons and new methods of global strategy—a moveable strategic air force of one hundred aircraft carriers, The United States, though tested by the most humiliating defeat of her history also won some of her greatest victories. Fighting two great wars simultaneously she won them both and now emerges upon a new state of world power, her arms of occupation spanning two oceans.

But victory was costly—costly in huge American cemeteries strewn across a map of the world. New names such as Bataan, Faid Pass, Corregidor, Salerno, Guadalcanal, Anzio, Coral Sea, Cassino, Midway, Tarawa, St. Lo, Saipan, Tinian, Iwo Jima, the Rhine, Okinawa, the Ardennes and countless others can never be forgotten by surviving Americans.

WASHINGTON, 14 August - A seven point program to speed the changeover of United States industry from a war basis to peacetime status was announced today by the War Manpower Commission. Program goes in effect at once and fifteen hundred United States employment service offices spread across country were instructed to assist industrials.

NEW YORK, 14 August - Ten vessels carrying more than 10,000 veterans of the European and Pacific war arrived in New York harbor.

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
