Ship Ends Cruise With Grade "Good"

An overall mark of "Good" wath a numerical rating of 78.0 was received by the Bermington on its Operation Readiness Inspection. The final mark was disclosed by Captain E. L. Tedder, Commander Fleet Training Unit, at a critique held in the wardroom fellowing the completion of the Battle Problem on Friday.

It was further revealed by Captain Tedder and the Fleet Training Group that several departments on the ship received ratings of "Excellent" on the final training exercise.

This group consisted of: the Medical Department, Combat Information Center, Ship Control, Navigation, Deck, for the Replemishment at sea Exercise, Gunnery for the Anti-aircraft firing exercise, and Damage Control for its efficient handling of the Hit Charlie during the Battle Problem.

The majority of the Department ratings were in the "Good" category thus giving the ship a well-balanced overall mark of "Good."

Short Periods at Norfolk, Virginia To Precede, Follow Midshipman Cruise; Complete Dates Given

Captain David B. Young announced on Friday that all efforts would be made toarrive at Gravesend Bay, New York, on Briday, 15 May. At the same time he also revealed that COMCAVDIV TWO and his staff would embark om the Bennington during the forthcoming Yard Availibility Period, and that the ship will make a summer Midshipman's Cruise to Helifax, Neve Scotia.

Portions of the staff of COM-CARDIV TWO will board the Benmington this week for the trip to New York. Rear Admiral T.N. Robbins and the remainder of his staff will embark at the New York Naval Shipyard, Brooklyn, at a date to be armounced.

The Middy Cruise is presently scheduled to depart Norfelk, Virginia, on July 27, returning to the Virginia port, on August 14. Four hundred and ten Midshipmen of the United States Nevel Academy will be abound for the three week cruise. Liberty will be granted in Halifex, Neve States on August 6,7,8, and9.
