OUCH!

Here's some information on those important inoculations you've been given and the ones you are to receive.

The first "sting" is given in the forearm and is the preventative against Typhoid Fever. The shot in the upper arm is Typhus, which is also a fever and is contracted by rats and dirt. This is referred to as a "louse born disease." The other injection is called cholera which can be recognized by diarrhea and intestinal trouble.

The second series of inoculations will be given shortly after leaving Chile and will consist of serums to ward off Smallpox and Tetanus (commonly called lockjaw). At this time most of the crew will receive booster shots for Typhus and Cholera.

What is being done by this process is this; infecting the person with a very mild form of these diseases, and in so doing, building up a resistance which will make him immune to germs prevalent in areas we visit.
