## Will Take PO Exams Over 750 men from ship's

company will take their advancement in rate tests when the Service Wide Examinations are given in February, according to LCDR L.F. Davis, Education Officer. In making the announcement

LCDR Davis added, 'Certain changes have been made with the introduction of a BuPers instruction released in August." In brief the instruction stated that all personnel who have been recommended for advancement by their division officers and have met all requirements, must first pass a performance test before taking the professional test in February.

The performance tests will be given aboard Bennington during the latter part of January. If an individual fails to pass the test be will be given an opportunity to take a similiar one before the Service Wide Exams are held. The dates of the Service Wide

Exams are as follows: CPO - 7 Feb., PO3 - 14 Feb., PO2 - 21 Feb., and PO1 - 28 Feb.
