# EVERY MAN A SPECIALIST

The United States Navy is an organization of experts. Almost every man is trained to become a specialist in his specific job. If you have had previous training or experience in a trade when you enlist, you will be given a chance to continue in the same type of work. If you have not had previous experience, you may qualify for training under skilled Navy instructors for the kind of job for which you are best fitted.

## 49 skilled jobs open to Navy men

There are seven branches of Naval Service for enlisted men comprising 49 different classes of jobs—or ratings. The men who hold these ratings are known as Petty Officers. There are four grades of Petty Officers—Third Class, Second Class, First Class and Chief—through which a man may advance according to his skill and experience.

Most men enlist as Apprentice Seamen. As such, you are automatically promoted with an increase in pay after two months of preliminary training. Thereafter, you may advance through trade school training or practical experience at sea as rapidly as your ability permits up through the various classes of Petty Officer. Men who qualify by reason of special training or experience in a trade may become Petty Officers in their particular specialty, provided there is a vacancy, immediately upon enlistment.

### WHAT ARE YOUR CHANCES OF GETTING A GOOD JOB IN THE NAVY?

*The odds are in your favor if you have the right kind of stuff. Over 50% of the enlisted men in the Navy are Petty Officers. Out of each 1000 men there are 250 Apprentice Seamen and Seamen, Second Class; 220 Seamen, First Class; 157 Petty Officers, Third Class; 153 Second Class and 140 First Class; 10 Acting and 70 Permanent Chief Petty Officers.*

## RATING BADGES FOR PETTY OFFICERS AND CHIEF PETTY OFFICERS



Rating badges, consisting of eagle, chevrons, and specialty mark, are worn on the sleeve between the shoulder and elbow. Your specialty mark indicates your job. Number of chevrons indicates your grade.

## GOOD PAY... QUICK PROMOTION

You'll go ahead fast in the Navy. The Navy wants you to become skilled in your trade. And it will move you up as rapidly as you can learn your job. You don't have to ask for promotions. If you're willing and able, they'll come to you automatically. And each one is accompanied by a raise in pay.

The table below shows the steps by which you can advance and the base pay you will receive:

**What are "allowances"?** They are increased pay for special qualifications and duties. For instance, suppose you are a Petty Officer, Third Class, making \$78 a month base pay. If you are assigned to sea duty or overseas service, you will immediately receive a special allowance which will raise your pay 20%—up to \$93.60 a month.

\*Listings on the following pages show \$138 pay for Chief Petty Officers. This is the base pay for Permanent Appointments. For Chief Petty Officers, Acting Appointments, the base pay in each rating is \$126.

# EXTRA PAY YOU MAY GET

Your base pay increases 5% after each three-year period of service, up to a maximum increase of 50%. While on sea duty or overseas service, you get a 20% increase in base pay. Parachutists get \$50 a month extra. Men on submarine duty get from \$5 to \$30 extra each month.

Men using arms get from \$1 to \$5 a month extra. These include gun captains, gun pointers, range finder operators, aircraft machine gunners, horizontal bombers, rifle sharpshooters and others. They also get special merit badges as shown on pages 22 and 23. Men who win a Medal of Honor, Distinguished Service Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross or Navy Cross receive an extra \$2 a month for each award.

## New Allowances for Dependents

Under a new law, Apprentice Seamen, Seamen Second and First Class, and Petty Officers Third Class may contribute for their dependents \$22 a month from their pay. To this amount the government will add \$28 a month for a wife, plus \$12 a month for the first child, \$10 a month for each additional child. For other members of the family who are proved to be dependent, the government will also contribute \$15 a month for one parent, \$25 a month for two parents and \$5 for each other family dependent up to a total of \$50.

Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers, First and Second Class, with dependent families (including wife, children, and dependent father or mother) will receive a dependent's quarters allowance of \$34.50 monthly.

## Protection For Your Family

Through National Service Life Insurance, a non-profit government agency, enlisted men may now take out from \$1,000 to \$10,000 life insurance for the benefit of their wives, children, parents or other dependent relatives. Premiums are low, from 64 cents a month per \$1,000 at age 17 to 72 cents a month per \$1,000 at 31, and \$1.27 a month per \$1,000 at 51, payable monthly, quarterly, semi-annually or annually. No physical exam if you take out your policy within 120 days after you enlist.

# GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ENLISTMENT

**Term of enlistment** — In the Regular Navy, 6 years. In the Naval Reserve, 2, 3 or 4 years. Naval Reservists will be released as soon as possible after the national emergency is over. The term of service for men who enlist at 17 automatically ends on the day preceding their 21st birthday. They may re-enlist.

**Citizenship** — Native-born American. If you are not native-born, you or your parents must have naturalization papers. You must show written proof of citizenship when you apply.

**Character** — The Navy wants men of good character. When you enlist you will be asked to furnish two references.

**Marriage** — In the Regular Navy and the Naval Reserve married men with dependents are accepted. There are special new allowances for dependents.

**Age** — In the Regular Navy, 17 to 31. In the Naval Reserve, 17 to 50. Men under 21 must have the written consent of their parents or guardian.

For enlistments directly in Petty Officer ratings, the following age limits are used as a guide in determining the grade in which you may enlist:

**Physical** — You must pass a physical exam to show you are in sound health. In the Naval Reserve requirements are less strict than in the Regular Navy.

**Height** — At least 5 feet, 2 inches. **Weight** — in proportion.

**Eyes** — Requirements modified. You can qualify with combined vision (both eyes) of 15/20 and not less than 6/20 in worst eye.

**Education** — Except for a few ratings, there are no specific educational or mental requirements. You will take a simple intelligence test to show ability to read, write and think clearly.

# PREVIOUS TRAINING NOT ESSENTIAL

Remember, you do not need previous training in civil life to advance from Apprentice Seaman to a Petty Officer rating. In most cases your advancement will depend upon two things: (1) initial training the Navy gives you after you have enlisted; (2) proof of your ability to apply that training.

Except for a few ratings, there are no special educational requirements. However, practically all Navy jobs call for use of arithmetic, mathematics, elementary physics and science. So if you have a basic knowledge of these subjects, it will help you to get more out of the training the Navy will give you.

In addition, if you have taken high school or college courses in any subject which has a special bearing on a particular Navy job, it will naturally help you to get ahead faster. For example, a course in manual training will be helpful to the man who wants to be a carpenter's mate. Knowledge of how to read blueprints will be valuable to machinists and metalsmiths, etc.

## Admission to Navy Trade Schools is by selection

Naturally, no promise can be made to any man at the time of enlisting that he will be placed in any of the Navy Trade Schools, because much depends on the man himself, his conduct, education, ambition, aptitude and adaptability. These qualifications are ascertained while he is taking his Recruit Training. Before finishing Recruit Training, each man is given a series of simple tests to determine his general intelligence and basic knowledge. If he makes right kind of showing, he is given an opportunity to apply for admission to any of the various Trade Schools.

Navy Trade Schools are grouped into five groups: (I) Electricity — Ordnance; (II) Communication — Clerical; (III) Machinist — Metal Worker; (IV) Aviation Machinist — Aviation Metalsmith — Aviation Ordnanceman — Aviation Radioman; (V) Buglers — Hospital Apprentice, second-class, and the Diesel School. Those who apply for Group III and IV schools are given an additional test of their mechanical aptitude.

All applicants are interviewed, their classification marks reviewed for the requirements of the school requested, and those who are best qualified are selected and enrolled in the school of their choice. Selection for all schools is based upon adaptability to learn the trade desired. So previous training is not essential.

# HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

The following pages show all the 49 classes of Navy jobs. The Petty Officer ratings of the men who hold these jobs are given, together with identifying insignia and base pay. Duties of the job are described, as well as practical knowledge which will help you. Corresponding civilian jobs are listed. If you have been working at one of these civil jobs, you may qualify as a Petty Officer right away. If you haven't had previous experience, Navy training will fit you to land a well paid job in one of these civilian fields after the war.

Certain jobs call for special age, physical, educational or mental requirements in addition to the general requirements listed on Page 4. In all such cases these special requirements are shown in connection with the job to which they apply.

Go over this list carefully. Pick the job for which you want to qualify. It may be your best step toward a successful future.

# OFFICIAL DESIGNATIONS FOR GENERAL ENLISTMENTS IN THE NAVAL RESERVE

The individual Navy ratings described on the preceding pages show where your training or experience in civil life may best be adapted to particular Navy jobs. These ratings fall under the following general classifications:

---

**CLASS V-1** Offers high school students the opportunity to complete the current scholastic year on inactive status.

---

**CLASS V-2** Men with mechanical experience between 17 and 28 years of age may be sent to aviation school and, upon completion, detailed to aviation duties if found qualified.

---

**CLASS V-3** Men with radio, communications, or clerical experience, between the ages of 17 and 28 may be sent to school in the same manner as CLASS V-2.

---

**CLASS V-6** General Service, Naval Reserve, involving all usual types of Naval service. Accepted as Apprentice Seaman with opportunities for advancement. Rating depends on qualifications and openings available. Higher grades depend on experience and openings available.

---

**CLASS M-1** Men of the U. S. Maritime service and Merchant Marine between the ages of 17 and 40. Ratings corresponding to certificates, position, and length of service available.

---

**CLASS M-2** Yachtsmen, fishermen, etc., eligible for ratings in coast patrol. Young men with genuine interest in going to sea accepted as Apprentice Seamen.

---

**CONSTRUCTION REGIMENT** Construction workers and tradesmen between the ages of 17 and 50. The physical requirements have been modified for color blindness and teeth. Many ratings available.

---

## SPECIAL

**CLASS V-1 (Accredited College Program)** offers college freshmen, sophomores, and high school seniors accepted into an accredited college an opportunity to continue their schooling and at the same time qualify for a Naval commission on the sea or in the air.

2. If you have not had special training or experience, decide which job you would like to learn.
3. If you have had special training or experience; decide for which Navy job you are best qualified.

6. Gather together the papers you will need to enlist: (1) written consent of parents if under 21; (2) birth certificate or written proof of citizenship; (3) two letters of recommendation; (4) high school diploma or certificate of college attendance if needed for the particular class and job you want.
7. Go to the nearest Navy Recruiting Station. There's one near your home. Addresses of all stations are shown on the following three pages.
