DEAR FELLOW VETERAN:

I congratulate you upon completion of your service in the armed forces and for your part in bringing to a conclusion a two-front war which resulted in the unconditional surrender of the Axis Powers.

Having been appointed by the President as Administrator of Veterans Affairs, I want to state generally the provisions made by our Government for you and other veterans.

Among the benefits that you may be entitled to are compensation for disabilities, hospitalization, home, farm and business loan guarantee, readjustment allowances, insurance, rehabilitation and vocational training, educational courses, assistance in obtaining employment and provision for your dependents.

Eligibility for each one is dependent upon the facts in the individual case.

If you are interested in any of these provisions, you should write or contact the Veterans Administration office nearest your home. For your convenience, there is, on the reverse of this letter, a list of the Regional Offices with the address of each office.

I feel I should warn you the last deduction for your Government insurance premiums has been made from your service pay. This means from now on you must make these premium payments directly to the Collections division, Veterans Administration, Washington 25, D. C.

DON'T LET YOUR INSURANCE LAPSE! YOU OWE THIS TO YOURSELF AND YOUR FAMILY.

I assure you that the Veterans Administration stands ready to serve you.

A MESSAGE TO ALL MAVAL RESERVE PERSONNEL

THE NEW MAYAL RESERVE - ITS ORGANIZATION:

Pending necessary legislation and appropriations, it is planned to stablish a port-unr leavn Reserve which will combine the best features of the Old Inval Reserve with a new streamlised organization, offering the use of rodorn endigened and training techniques. The new lavel Reserve will be divided into two main brunches — the Ready Reserve.

The Ready Regerve: This group will be composed of trained officers and men who will be available immediately for mobilization to fill hillets at see and ashore in the event of a national energency. The Ready Reserve will be divided further into General Duty Officers and men, and Special duty Officers and men, and each of these divisions will be subdivided into Aviation and Surface components. Menbers of the Rendy Reserve will drill one night a week in an armory. or other suitable location, for which they will receive one day's pay per drill. These drills will include practical work in your specialty: lectures, films, and trips to naval and industrial activities. Members of the Ready Reserve will be eligible to take a two-week cruise abourd a modern combat ship, or perform training duty ashore, with full pay and allowances. An individual will be ordered to training duty only with his consent. It is contemplated that training in specialized fields, such as electronics, physics, and internal combustion engines will be open to officers and nen in the Pendy Reserve.

Thenefor to the Boody Reserve within quota will be elective for each individual, The Standby Reserve will also consist of General and Special Daty divisions, and subvivisions of Artation and Surprise components.

There will also be an Honorary Heal Reserve, to remark and provide for the retention of personnel no longer qualified or available for other divisions of the U.S. Harml Reserve as a result of age, occupation, physical disability, or other causes. Inchese of the Honorary Years Reserve may be called to octive duty, with their obsent, for early division of the control of the control Reserve and the control of cattle day during a war or period of National Reserves.

ADVANTAGES OF JOINING THE NAVAL RESERVE

- In the event of a mational emergency you will not start all over again but will retain your commission or rate. You will qualify as a trained individual who can fill a responsible position with little or no additional training.
- * The time you spend in the Naval Reserve -- either the Ready Reserve or the Standby Reserve -- will count toward promotion for officers and advancement in retime for enliated men.
- * You will receive longevity benefits in higher pay.
- * You will increase your knowledge through actual experience with modern equipment.
- * You can keep up-to-date on naval matters through a magazine to be published for the members of the Naval Reserve
- * You will receive pay for drilling once a week if you are in the Reudy Reserve.
- * You may go on a cruise or training duty once a year, with your consent, if you are a nember of the Ready Reserve, and will receive full pay and allowances, including travel without cost to you, to and from your home during that time.
- * Your training cruise will provide an interesting change from your ordinary life, and wherever possible you will be given opportunities for shore leave in a foreign port.
- * Enlisted men who can meet the qualifications will have an opportunity to be commissioned.
- * You will have the prestige of being a member of the Armed Forces of the United States and the personal satisfaction of serving your country.
- * You will be associated with a splendid group of officers end men. You will have an opportunity to maintain meny of the close friendships you made during the wer and to make new ones.
- * A sufficient number of up-to-date training courses will be available to enlisted men studying for advancement in rating, and a training officer will be included in the complement of each division of the Ready Reserve.
